

our way of obtaining information in social network is similar to the combination of multi-take cuts and cross-cuts in cinematic language

An editing technique in which the exact same action is filmed from various angles all around the subject, then edited together with Jump Cuts amongst all the different angles.


A fragmented presentation of the same event by different people


A film editing technique that involves switching between scenes, making it seem like the action in different locations is happening at the same time. It's also known as parallel editing.








Diagram


